Stone is a clinician scientist educator at the Clinical Translational Sciences Institute, Indiana University School of Medicine. She has translational research expertise in evidence based non-pharmacological complementary and integrative health. Jennifer serves as Co-Chair of the Indiana Consortium for Integrative Medicine and Health at Indiana University School of Medicine and is Indiana University's representative to the Academic Consortium for Integrative Medicine and Health.

Her clinical training is in acupuncture and Chinese medicine, and she has 34 years' experience treating patients in the clinic. Her primary clinical expertise is the treatment of idiopathic and neuropathic pain, peripheral neuropathy, and wound care in seniors and veterans. Her research interests include exploring mechanistic pathways behind the effects of acupuncture on neuropathy and wound healing in seniors.

Jennifer has 15 years' experience serving as editor in chief and senior editor of 4 international biomedical journals and is currently the EIC of Medical Acupuncture, published by MaryAnn Liebert/SAGE. She has specific expertise in research and publication ethics and medical misinformation. She has published and presented on publication ethics and teaches "Ethics of CAM" for Indiana University School of Medicine Bioethics Lecture Series for physician scientists.
