Weill Cornell Medical College (WCMC)

Founded in 1898, the Joan and Sanford I. Weill Medical College of Cornell University is among the top-ranked clinical and medical research centers in the U.S. The Medical College has been affiliated with what is now NewYork-Presbyterian Hospital (NYPH) since 1927. It is an integral part of a world-renowned center of academic medicine and biomedical research.

With a triple mission of education, research and patient care, the Medical College offers the Doctor of Medicine (M.D.) degree, Ph.D. programs in biomedical research and education at Weill Graduate School of Medical Sciences, and a joint M.D.-Ph.D. program in cooperation with Rockefeller University and Memorial Sloan-Kettering Cancer Center.

Weill Cornell physicians have made, and continue to make, major contributions to medical research in key areas. They have led the way for such advances as the Pap test for cervical cancer, the first “double-blind” controlled experiment to test the efficacy of drugs, and the synthesis of penicillin. Research is currently being carried out in a wide range of fields, and Weill Cornell experts are leaders in the field of clinical gene therapy.

Hamad Medical Corporation (HMC)

Established by Emiri decree in 1979, HMC is the premier not-for-profit healthcare provider in the State of Qatar.

HMC manages five hospitals in Doha, the Hamad General Hospital, the Women's Hospital, Rumailah Hospital, Al-Amal Cancer Hospital and the Psychiatric Hospital, as well as the Hamad International Training Center. Nationwide, the Corporation manages a network of 21 primary health care centers that provide a range of services, including family medicine, preventive medicine and a number of specialized services such as ophthalmology.

HMC is mandated to provide the best quality care for patients irrespective of nationality, and to play a major part in Qatar's drive to meet, and exceed, global targets, as defined in the World Health Organization's "Health for All" campaign. Since its establishment, the Corporation has developed specialized medical facilities that offer levels of diagnosis and treatment that were previously only available overseas.

Weill Cornell Medical College in Qatar (WCMC-Q)

Established in partnership with the Qatar Foundation for Education, Science and Community Development, Weill Cornell Medical College in Qatar is a branch campus of Weill Cornell Medical College in New York, the first American institution to offer its M.D. degree overseas.

WCMC-Q offers a complete and integrated educational program, with teaching by Cornell University faculty. It comprises the two-year Pre-medical Program, followed by the four-year Medical Program which replicates the curriculum offered at Weill Cornell in New York. There are separate admissions processes for each Program.

The first pre-medical classes began in September 2002; the Medical Program opened in September 2004, with sixteen students in the Inaugural Class, of whom fourteen had successfully completed the Pre-medical Program.
