Doha, 6 June, 2007: High school students aspiring to be the doctors of the future got to meet the leaders of Weill Cornell Medical College in Qatar (WCMC-Q) at a ceremony at Al Bayan Educational Complex for Girls.

The ceremony, titled ‘Doctors of the Future’ recognized the achievement of seventeen students who will be pursuing medicine as a career including nine who have already been accepted into WCMC-Q and others who have applications pending.

The students presented each other with white coats and stethoscopes to mark their achievement and thanked their mentors – faculty from Al Bayan School and WCMC-Q – for their valuable guidance and support. Among them were Dean of WCMC-Q Dr. Daniel R. Alonso, Associate Dean of Admissions and Student Affairs Dr. Maya Hammoud and Associate Dean of Pre-medical Education Dr. David Robertshaw.

Al Bayan student Laila Ghassan said she would be proud to study medicine at WCMC-Q because it was considered one of the best medical schools in the region.

“Since I was a small girl I have wanted to be a doctor. It is a dream of mine,” Laila commented. “But aside from that, our society and our country have given us so much, and we need to give back. Qatar needs more doctors, so it is time to step up.”

Dr. Hammoud added: “By reaching out to the schools in this way we are helping to develop interest in science, bio-medical science and careers as physicians. Long-term this will help boost Qatar’s drive to establish a knowledge-based economy investing in education and healthcare.”
