WCMC-Q Announces ‘Healing Hands’ Contest Winners

Doha, 16 June 2008 – Weill Cornell Medical College in Qatar (WCMC-Q) has announced the winners of its first annual high school essay contest. For submitting equally outstanding essays, Mohammad Hajji from Middle-East International School and Alaa Al-Na’ama from Al Bayan Secondary School for Girls were selected.

Under this year’s inaugural theme, ‘Healing Hands: Being a Doctor in Qatar’, WCMC-Q opened the contest to all high school students to encourage them to share their thoughts on what it would mean to be doctors in Qatar and what are the particular issues that might affect a physician practicing in the country. Over 100 entries were received with special mention for the top 20 at a special ceremony at the college.

Mohammad and Alaa received the Doctor of the Future Summer Scholarship: a fully funded, two-week experience at Weill Cornell Medical College in New York City, where they will visit research laboratories and spend time with distinguished Weill Cornell physicians. The two set off in July for the experience of a lifetime.

Commenting on a specially recorded video link all the way from New York, Dr. Ronald G. Crystal, M.D., Professor of Genetic Medicine at WCMC-NY, said: “All the entries were excellent and it was interesting to see how doctors are perceived by high school students. I congratulate you all on the effort you put into this and look forward to welcoming the winners to our research labs in New York City. We want to encourage the younger generations of Qatar to become doctors. This is very important for Qatar and its future.”

Speaking after the announcement, contest winner Mohammad Hajji said: “I would like to thank Her Highness Sheikha Mozah Bint Nasser Al-Missned and His Highness, the Emir of Qatar, Sheikh Hamad Bin Khalifa Al-Thani, for the opportunities that they are creating for us in the country. I would also like to thank my parents for their support and WCMC-Q for making such opportunities available to us.”

Alaa Al-Na’ama, commented: “WCMC-Q has brought forward a new generation of doctors to Qatar. This contest was my first step into realizing my dream of becoming a doctor and I am very happy to have succeeded. I am very grateful to WCMC-Q.”
