WCMC-Q Embraces New Goals Under Leadership of Dean Javaid Sheikh

Doha, Feb. 23, 2010 – As Weill Cornell Medical College in Qatar goes forward with new leadership, it is setting it sights on becoming the best medical college in this part of the world, said Dr. Javaid Sheikh at a reception this week in honor of his appointment as dean.

"We want to make WCMC-Q the best medical college not only in the Middle East and North Africa but also in Asia," said Dr. Sheikh at the reception that included leadership from Weill Cornell Medical College in New York, Hamad Medical Corporation and the Supreme Council of Health. "This is one of four new goals we will work to achieve over the next five years," said Dr. Sheikh. A second goal is helping to build a broad local workforce. "We have to produce not only physicians but also people who will become scientists and health care leaders," he said. The college also will focus on integrating its three-part mission of education, research and patient care more closely with partners HMC and Sidra. "And, finally, we will work to make WCMC-Q an even more valuable citizen of Qatar by becoming more involved with the Supreme Council of Health and its planning for the country," said Dr. Sheikh.

"Over the next several weeks, we plan to develop very specific strategies and tactics to meet these goals and specific milestones to assess our progress."

The reception was held at the Four Seasons Hotel in honor of Dr. Sheikh's appointment Jan. 1 as dean of the medical college to replace Dr. Daniel Alonso, who helped establish the college and served as its dean through the graduation of its first class of medical students.

WCMC Chairman of the Board of Overseers Sanford Weill has firmly supported the medical college in Qatar, said Vice Dean Havva Idriss at the reception. "Those of us who have had the privilege to be involved with this project are indebted to his support and vision," she said. "We are delighted that the story of WCMC-Q goes on under new leadership and we look forward to continued growth and development."
