## WCMC-Q Launches *Qira'at Readings* Book to Public

**Doha, March 22, 2009** – Weill Cornell Medical College in Qatar (WCMC-Q) presents the launch of an anthology of winning essays by future doctors in Qatar entitled *Qira'at: Readings from the Students of Weill Cornell Medical College in Qatar, 2004-2008.* The launch, held at Waqif Art Center on March 22<sup>nd</sup>, 2009, will include public readings of several essays to be followed by a book signing in the Afkar Bookstore.

*Qira'at: Readings from the Students of Weill Cornell Medical College in Qatar, 2004-2008* is a compilation of the best essays produced by students of the Medical College. Students were encouraged to submit essays of any kind, provided they were written as part of their college course work. WCMC-Q faculty selected 27 essays for publication from those entered in the competition.

WCMC-Q is donating proceeds to the Qatar National Cancer Society (QNCS). Dr. Alan Weber, Assistant Professor of English at WCMC-Q stated, "We are very excited to partner with QNCS. The editors did not want to make a profit from the book because it is solely an educational and artistic project, so we decided to send all profits to the Cancer Society. The book gives the general public a glimpse of what WCMC-Q medical students are writing about and helps an organization raising funds to educate people about cancer."

QNCS is a national society whose objective is to control cancer through public awareness. The main purpose of the society lies in the fact that almost 70% of cancer can be prevented and controlled through lifestyle choices. Nevertheless, many citizens and residents die every year as a result of this life-threatening disease.

"We are thrilled to receive the proceeds of the book sale from WCMC-Q and honored to be partnered with them. QNCS is a valuable resource for cancer patients, their families, and the community. The proceeds of *Qira'at* will go directly towards the treatment of cancer patients," said Dr AbdulAzim Hussain, Vice Chairman of QNCS.

Our goal is to nurture artistic excellence and discover emerging writers. By launching WCMC-Q's *Qira'at*, we are connecting writers with an audience and developing a community."

Tasnim Khalife (Class of 2010), whose essay "Rieux: A Willing Victim of Abstraction" was named First Place Prize winner stated, "Besides being honored that my essay has been included in the book, I'm also pleased that the profits from the book will help educate people on ways to reduce their cancer risk and help in the treatment of cancer patients."
